ANIIDCO

News: "Empower the guardians of the earth, do not rob them."

Context: Union Shipping Ministry is making ambitious plans for high-end tourism along with a shipbuilding and repair yard on Great Nicobar Island.

About Mega Infrastructure Project in Great Nicobar:

- Promoted by NITI Aayog.
- Project cost outlay is Rs. 72, 000 crore.
- Location: Great Nicobar (southernmost island of A&N archipelago).
- Proposed infrastructure:
 - Construction of a trans-shipment port at proposed at Galathea Bay.
 - · Greenfield airport.
 - · Tourism and township project.
 - · Solar and gas-based power plants.
- Proponent for implementation of project is ANIIDCO.

About: Andaman and Nicobar Islands Integrated Development Corporation (ANIIDCO):

- Incorporated under Companies Act 1956 in 1988, but not established under the Act, so it is not a Statutory body.
- Objective of ANIIDCO:
 - To develop and commercially exploit natural resources for the balanced and environment friendly development of the territory.
- Main activities of ANIIDCO:
 - Trading of petroleum products, Indian made foreign liquor and milk.
 - · Managing tourism resorts.
 - · Infrastructure development for tourism and fisheries.

Issues with proposed Mega Infrastructure Project:

- Solar power plant construction will involve razing nearly a million trees in about 130 square km of rainforest.
- Criticism from experts over the denotification of the Galathea Bay Wildlife Sanctuary for a ₹72,000 crore mega project on Great Nicobar, a UNESCO Biosphere Reserve.
- · Project will devastate:
 - · About 8 to 10 lakh evergreen forest trees.
 - Smother and gouge out scores of coral reefs found along Galathea Bay.
 - Destroy the nesting site for the globally endangered *Leatherback sea turtle species.*
 - Devastate hundreds of nesting mounds of Nicobar Megapodes, and kill as many crocodiles.
- Displacement of the 'Shompen tribe' (semi-nomadic forest dwelling PVTG of Great Nicobar).
 - Ecologist view: Tribes may be few in number but their knowledge of the forests is supreme. They are happy, joyful. They have their own understanding of the universe. Let them remain the way they are. If they need us, they will reach out.
 - · Other tribes in area: Menchal/Pingaeyak and Meroe/Piruii.

H5N1 VIRUS

News: "Quarantine animals with bird flu symptoms, Centre tells States after tiger, leopard deaths."

About H5N1 Virus:

- Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza but can occasionally infect humans and other animals.
- Caused widespread global outbreak, carried by migratory birds.
- The outbreak is estimated to have killed millions of birds and the virus has infected over 200 mammalian species, including humans.
- Neurotropism: refers to the affinity or tendency of certain pathogens, viruses, or biological agents to specifically target and affect the nervous system, particularly neurons.
- Three tigers and one leopard died of the H5N1 virus, better known as bird flu, at an animal rescue centre in Nagpur in the last week of December.
- Centre tells States, quarantine animals with bird flu symptoms after tiger, leopard deaths.

HUMAN META-PNEUMO-VIRUS (HMPV)

News: "Nothing alarming."

About HMPV:

- HMPV virus was first identified in children in 2001 in the Netherlands.
- The virus causes upper and/or lower respiratory tract infections, with lower respiratory tract infections being among the most common.
- While the virus often causes only mild disease.
- Union Health Ministry noted that the situation in China is "not unusual in view of the ongoing flu season".
- WHO and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have not raised a red flag so far.

MEDOG DAM

News: "Implications of China's mega-dam project."

About Medog Dam on Yarlung Tsang-po:

- Yarlung Tsang-po (Tibetan name of Brahmaputra), it flows through Arunachal Pradesh and Assam.
- Announced mega dam project is in the deep gorges of the eastern Himalayas that fall under Chinese control.
- The mega dam is designed to be the largest infrastructure project in the world. Once constructed, the gigantic dam would dwarf even the Three Gorges Dam (on River Yangtze).
- The site of Medog dam being built by China, seen one of the greatest earthquakes of modern times, the 1950 Medog Earthquake, or the Assam-Tibet Earthquake its disastrous effects still continues with unending cycle of annual catastrophic floods.

About Tibetan River Systems:

- Tibet's river systems are important to the Earth's cryosphere, comprising permafrost and glaciers, and major climate systems directing climate and precipitation pathways such as the monsoon.
 - Glacial Lake Outburst Floods (GLOFs) have increased in the Himalayas with climate change events, exemplified by the Chungthang Dam collapse in Sikkim (October 2023).

About Brahmaputra:

- Brahmaputra is a transboundaryHimalayan river basin spanning four riparian countries (China, Bhutan, India, Bangladesh).
- Brahmaputra originates from the Kailash ranges of the Himalayas in southern Tibet and confluence with river Ganga before it drains into Bay of Bengal.
- A classic example of a braided river, with many channels that split and rejoin.
- The Brahmaputra River makes a U-turn in its course as it crosses India due to the syntaxial bending of the Himalayas.
- The Brahmaputra splits into two channels in Assam, which rejoin to form Majuli Island, the world's largest river island.
 - The syntaxial bends are deep knee-bend flexures that occur at the eastern and western extremities of the Himalayas. These bends are caused by the southward turn of the mountain chain.
- · Developments countries on Brahmaputra:
 - China: Zangmu dam, Medog dam (recently announced).
 - India: announced its largest dam project at upper Siang.
 - Bhutan: had been planning to building several medium, to small dams.
- None of the riparian countries of the Brahmaputra river basin have signed the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Non-navigational Uses of International Watercourses of 2014, and hence first user-rights on river systems are non-enforceable.

BANIHAL BYPASS

News: "Four-lane Banihal bypass opens in J&K's Ramban."

About Banihal bypass:

- A four lane 2.35km stretch, strategically located on NH-44, will boost 'national security logistics' and tourism in J&K.
- Strategically located on the Ramban–Banihal section of National Highway 44.
 - NH-44 is a major highway in India. The longest in the country, it stretches from Srinagar in the north to Kanniyakumari in the south.
- Centre has embarked on a major mission in J&K to ensure that the *NH-44 remains an all-weather road connecting* the Kashmir Valley with the rest of the country.
